Careers provision at Venn Sullivan Centre

All Pupils have access to the following:

- Extra curricula clubs and trips to support pupils in developing their understanding of a range of different subjects.
- Talks on a range of careers that inspire and motivate the pupils
- All pupils can book careers appointments
- All pupils have access to careers information and access to the careers area on the website
- All Pupils take part in Enterprise projects across the year, once a term
- All pupils can attend careers events
- Pupils have their own Gro Far login, a careers passport that enables all work to be logged in-line with the Gatsby Benchmark.
- Year 11 pupils have a 'Log on, Move on' account, enabling them to apply for next steps in their journey through the gateway website

- Transition from one key stage to another

- Pupils take part in Enterprise projects across the year, once a term

Pupil Premium

- Personalised support will be given to these pupils and they will receive an extra careers appointment in Year 10

Key stage 3

- Pupils take part in Enterprise projects across the year, once a term
- STEM events and projects are a key part of KS3 Curriculum
- The curriculum in Year 9 is designed to support pupils in their GCSEs choices
- Pupils introduced to careers websites and resources
- Pupils to be exposed to a range of careers options linked within subjects.
- Pupils take part in self-awareness activities, linking possibilities of career journeys to this

Key stage 4

- Pupils take part in Enterprise projects across the year, once a term.
- One to one meetings with families and the school Careers Lead in Year 10-11.
- Pupils in Year 10 and 11 experience work experience and work-based placements.
- Pupils in Year 10 and 11 have the opportunity to access different training providers to develop the variety of experiences they have to support informed choices about the future education, training and employment pathways
- Year 10 pupils receive significant careers input in tutor time, e.g. career quizzes, career video presentations.

Pupil Entitlement

All pupils in Year 6-13 are entitled:

- To find out technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

Opportunities for access

A number of events, integrated into the school careers programme, will offer providers an opportunity to come into school to speak to pupils and/or their parents/carers.

Work experience at Venn Sullivan Centre

The aim of work experience is to provide an opportunity for all pupils to learn the workplace; an experience that cannot be replicated in school. All pupils are offered work experience in year 10. Where possible the pupils are encouraged to sort their own work experience. Parents/carers are informed and communicated with throughout the whole process and a work experience agreement is signed by all parties. All pupils on placement are covered by the employers' insurance and places of work are risk assessed.
